In this program, attendees will examine trauma-informed care practices in a correctional facility. Attendees will learn about treating mental distress among incarcerated populations. Attendees will explore mental health-related job opportunities in the correctional system.



Anthony Waters obtained his Psychology Doctorate from The George Washington University. He has trained and worked extensively at the intersection of public health, the criminal-legal system, and behavioral health, including at Walter Reed Army Medical Center, the New York Police Department, and NYC Department of Health and Mental Hygiene. Dr. Waters presents and trains widely on topics such as trauma-informed care, verbal de-escalation, and the diagnosis of mental disorders. Dr. Waters is the Senior Vice President, Chief of Behavioral Health for YesCare where he oversees behavioral health services in a nationwide network of jails and prisons. He also maintains a small private practice with clients including Major League Baseball. Dr. Waters' peer- reviewed publications are concentrated in the area of mental health programming in correctional settings.
